LOUMC is moving to a new kind of record keeping solution called ***Realm***. The staff have been working with Realm since the beginning of the year and are excited to roll it out to you, our church family, in the weeks ahead!

***“Why Realm?”*** you might ask!  
Realm is helping us:

- 1....update the administrative tools our staff uses to run the daily operations.
- 2....add more ways to communicate, while leaving most current methods in place.
3. ***You*** determine how much you want to make this part of your experience with our church, ***but we encourage you to participate!***

#### ***How to Participate***

When We Roll Out, ***Get the Mobile App and Connect!***

**Stay connected** to our church wherever you go by downloading the free Realm Connect app for iPhone and Android devices. Use it to communicate with your groups and teams at the church, RSVP to events, manage your giving, update profile information, and more. It makes it easier for us to connect throughout the week and know what's happening.

- News** – Keeps everyone up-to-date with the latest posts, photos, and events for your groups and teams
- Posts** – Post messages to your group and comment on posts by others in your group or team
- Photos** – Capture your moments together and share them with your group or team
- Events** – See event details, submit your RSVP, and sign up to bring something
- Files** – Access your group or team's shared files
- Chat** – Send your entire group, team, or select individuals, a chat

## A Word from Pastor Clay

Beloved People of LOUMC,

The Spirit is moving and the light of resurrection is shining. Great things are happening here at LOUMC and I'm grateful to be part of it all. "What great things are happening?" I'm so glad you asked!

Moving, meaningful worship is happening. We're entering into Lent and then, of course, into Holy Week and Easter. This season is often the most powerful time in the life of our church as we spend time reflecting on the struggles and frailties we experience in our lives, only to meet the Resurrected Christ in the dawning light of Easter.

Fellowship is happening. During Lent we'll gather on Tuesday evenings for a soup supper and then we'll learn from one another about the heroes of the faith with this year's twist on My Best Thought: "My Best Saint." (And those saints could be famous official saints like St. Francis or St. Clare, or they could be unofficial but highly influential saints like your grandmother or a teacher you met along life's journey.)

Service with our neighbors is happening. Our partnership with The Father's Heart is continuing to grow. We'll be hearing from our TFH partners in worship and we'll be finding more opportunities to share in their vital work of caring for unhoused and hungry neighbors.

Ministry with youth and young people is happening. Thanks to a generous anonymous donation and support from our bequest funds, we've been able to expand our Youth Ministries Leader position from 10 to 20 hours per week. We have a new young adult group that meets twice monthly, and our youth ministries continues to offer fellowship and discipleship to our youth.

A new way of organizing the life of our congregation is happening! As we introduce our new congregational connection hub (Realm!), we'll find ways to make use of this powerful tool to connect people and ministries, to reach out to visitors, and to build on the strengths that make LOUMC a great faith family.

AND THERE'S SO MUCH MORE! New people in worship, new ministries and opportunities, growing connections to our community and with other churches, and so much more... It's a great time to be the pastor here. And I hope you're finding it to be a good and inspiring time to be a part of LOUMC.

It's easy to feel disheartened by the state of our world. And while we are called to name the truth of the brokenness and sin we see, we are also called to be part of God's healing work. Being part of a thriving faith community is a large part of how we hear God's call to labor for justice, and support one another in the journey of faith.

Thanks be to God for the ways that LOUMC is living out its mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

The service was "...truly a witness of healing and forgiveness for generations [of] sins and harm the Church has done to our brothers and sisters..." over the years, according to Children's ministries leader Liz Whitson. What a spirit filled gathering!

The group was hosted over the weekend by families from the congregation. Worship and story time were followed by questions and answers along with a good old fashioned Methodist potluck meal. We are so thankful to Dewey and the entire group for joining us, sharing their culture with us and leading us in worship. Our youth have been lucky to spend time with this group during summer SLAM (Students Learning About Missions) cross cultural collaborative service and learning trips. May we continue to build relationships, make connections and break down cultural walls that divide with them!

## Church Board News

On the weekend of January 23 - 25, the LOUMC Leadership Board met offsite at the Collins Retreat Center near Sandy for some fellowship, planning, and strategizing about the new year. The purpose of the retreat was not to make final decisions about things, but more to set the stage for how the board is going to operate this year.

An important reality of the Single Board Governance model that the church adopted a few years ago is that the board is there to set overall goals and provide strategic direction for guiding the church in its mission "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for transformation of the world."

The challenge is turning that into concrete reality. In many ways, LOUMC is already very much involved in that mission: as a

corporate entity, through such things as our intentional relationship with The Father's Heart; and as individuals within the congregation, through countless outreach activities. The board, as one of the agreements coming out of the retreat, will be actively involved in finding additional ways to build on all these efforts in further pursuit of the overall mission. And suggestions from the congregation are most welcome!

Much of the retreat was dedicated to getting people settled into their roles. On our 9 person board, 4 people are new this year (marked with a \* below), so there is a good deal of orientation we needed to go through so people are clear on what their responsibilities and opportunities are as board members.
